Strategic Plan for the Orthodox Church in America:

A Comprehensive Action Plan for the Next Decade

This overview will address 4 main areas

- The 'history' of the Strategic Plan
- An overview of the current Draft Plan
- What we all will be doing on the strategic plan at this All American Council
- What happens after the AAC?

The Special Investigative Committee and the 15th AAC called for developing a Strategic Plan

- To reexamine the organizational structure of the Church
- To help the Church heal and focus on the future
- To reach out broadly to all in the Church for their input

The Metropolitan Council formed a Strategic Planning Committee

~1/3 of Metropolitan Council participated in the SPC

The SPC reached out broadly to the Church for input:

- ✓ The Metropolitan, Lesser Synod, Holy Synod & Metropolitan Council
- ✓ Web postings (OCA and non-OCA)
- ✓ The OCA Department Heads
- ✓ Diocesan Assemblies
- ✓ The Seminaries (SVS, STS)
- ✓ Working Groups on each of the Goals (>60 people)
- ✓ Featured interview in *The Orthodox Church*
- ✓ Interview on Ancient Faith Radio
- Workshop Sessions at 16th All American Council

The SPC received strong feedback on the 1st 'Draft Plan'

- <u>Do not</u> address organizational issues in this plan this is not the time and not your purview
- Make a clear statement on the autocephaly of the Orthodox Church in America
- Focus the plan on priorities for ministries in the coming decade – make these concrete and actionable

This change in direction was blessed by the Holy Synod

Therefore the revised Draft Strategic Plan focuses on 3 key questions

- Who are we and where are we going?
- What should our ministry priorities be for the coming decade?
- How do the Central Administration, the dioceses, and the parishes work together in accomplishing these ministry priorities?

This draft is not the final answer, it is the initial leaven for our work here at the AAC!

The entire plan is rooted in the fundamental mission of the OCA

As the Body of Christ, the Orthodox Church in America is committed to bringing the Gospel to all the people of North America –embracing all languages, cultures and races. This is Christ's commandment to "Go into all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that [He has commanded us]" (Mt. 28:19-20).

Who we are and where we are going?

Who we are:

- We are the local autocephalous Church of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church
- Our mission to North America began in 1794 when Orthodox monks arrived in Alaska to bring Orthodoxy to the native people
- Our mission remains the same: "Go and make disciples"
- We strive to do this in a conciliar manner: Bishops, clergy, laity working together

As we move into the future we will focus on:

- Internal spiritual renewal and growth, so that we may radiate the life in Christ to all those around us.
- Reaching out to others to fulfill the Savior's commandment to love one another as He has loved us (Jn. 13:34); and
- Actively cooperating to form a fully united autocephalous Orthodox Church in North America, embracing all Orthodox Christians.

We have identified 10 top level goals for the coming decade

GOAL: Develop Christ-centered, healthy, growing parishes

- Commit to a gospel centered vision
- Celebrate vibrant worship
- Provide tools for parish development
- Provide opportunities to develop lay leadership
- Develop a sense of authentic community
- Support personal and family formation
- Active service to others

GOAL: Improve leadership & management skills at all levels of the Church

- Define leadership and management within context of the Orthodox Church
- Assemble existing training materials
- With approval of the Holy Synod, develop an OCA Leadership and Management Skills training curriculum and implementation plan
- Communicate, disseminate, and implement the training plan

GOAL: Better equip our Church for the ministry of evangelization

- Make evangelization a priority: include as part of the seminary curriculum, hold conferences, identify and enable gifted individuals
- Establish and implement clear cut goals for mission planting: identify top 100 new locations; fund 10 mission planting grants per year; provide oversight of those grants
- Rethink policy and funding for mission plants

The other 7 top level goals are:

- 1. Revitalize our diocese-parish relationships
- 2. More fully involve our high school and college age members in the life of the Church
- 3. Establish a vision for theological education for the Orthodox Church in America
- 4. Nurture strong inter-Orthodox relations
- 5. Provide for continuing education of clergy and laity
- 6. Transition to a sounder way of funding the Church
- 7. Address contemporary cultural/moral/social issues

This All American Council is the next step in the strategic planning process

There are 3 main strategic planning goals for the AAC

- Continue to evolve the plan
- Begin building the human networks to implement the the specific goals
- Obtain a 'sense of the council' for
 - Moving forward with the plan
 - Requesting that the MC pursue additional funding for the plan
 - Requesting that the PCC establish a Post-Conciliar
 Committee (PoCC) to oversee implementation

Four of the eight AAC sessions will address strategic planning

- Plenary II: SP Overview (1 hr)
- Plenary III: Workshops 1 (3hr)
- Plenary V: Workshops 2 (3hr)
- Plenary VII: Summary and steps forward

All Workshops will follow a standard template

Workshop 1 – What can the <u>Church do?</u>

- 1A: What did you like in the draft plan for your goal? What was off/missing?
- 1B: What should the <u>Church</u> (central, diocesan, deanery, parish) do to achieve this specific goal? List up to 4 steps/objectives

Workshop Templates - 2

Workshop 2 – What can <u>I/we</u> networked together do? (keeping in mind that what is not possible by man <u>is possible with God</u>)

2A: Identify up to 3 specific projects

2B: For each project clearly state

- what it will achieve
 - how it will be achieved (steps and timelines)
 - what resources are needed (skills, people, \$)

At the end of the Workshop people will be asked to volunteer to be on an Implementation Team

The wrap-up session will:

- Briefly summarize <u>some</u> of the projects coming out of the Workshop Sessions
- Described the next steps forward
- Seeking a 'sense of the AAC':
 - Approving the Strategic Plan
 - Urging the Metropolitan Council to pursue additional funding sources for it
 - Asking the Metropolitan Council to form a Post-Conciliar Committee to oversee implementation

Following the AAC, we will take the following actions

- Immediately
 - Transition SPC into an interim Post-Conciliar Committee
 - Update Strategic Plan to reflect outcome of AAC
 - Workshop volunteers become nucleus of Implementation
 Teams
- By January, 2012
 - Full Implementation Teams are in place
 - Each team has decided on how it will work remotely

Transition to Implementation - 2

- By Spring, 2012 Metropolitan Council meeting:
 - Detailed implementation plan, budget, and funding case for each goal;
 - Implementation Team chair 'makes their case' to the MC
 - Standing Post-Conciliar Committee (PoCC) formed

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Isn't the Gospel our 'strategic plan'?:

- Everything we do should be rooted in the Gospel
- Christ calls us to be 'wise stewards' and wisely use our "talents' – this takes planning


This doesn't look like a typical strategic plan

- That's correct it's not driven by statistics (though those can be found in some read-aheads)
- It's driven by Christ teachings

FAQs - 2

Won't this 'grow' the central administration and the assessment?


- No, not necessarily. The focus is on what the Church as a whole should be doing – and then figuring out what is done best at each level
- There is no plan to raise the assessment. If added funds are needed for ministries they will be raised by other means. We believe that if we make convincing cases and commit to absolute transparency the funds will be there.

- QUESTIONNAIRE INCLUDED SOLICITATION OF INFORMATION REGARDING FINANCES AND GOVERNANCE.
- ALL INSTITUTIONS IDENTIFIED AS STAVROPEGIAL RESPONDED TIMELY



16TH ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL INTERNAL AUDITOR'S REPORT ANALYSIS

- DOCUMENTS FROM ALL STAVROPEGIAL INSTITUTIONS PROVIDED FOR INDEPENDENT OPERATION AND COMPOSITION OF GOVERNANCE.
- EXCEPT FOR SEMINARIES, STAVROPEGIAL INSTITUTIONS HAD LITTLE IN THE WAY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS OR OPERATIONS.
- AUDITS WERE INAPPROPRIATE FOR MOST STAVROPEGIAL INSTITUTIONS.
- SEMINARIES HAVE BEEN AUDITED FOR THE RELEVANT PAST.

2. Recap of FY2011 versus Budget

- Assumptions used in budget preparation:
 - Core structure of Central Admin remains the same as 2010.
 - Legal Fees budget would be less than prior years
 - Due to the losses sustained in 2008 and 2009 which reduced our Net Assets from \$2 million to under \$500K, prudent to budget small surplus
 - Operational funds would be used to augment FOS/Charity/Missions appeal funds to provide additional funding for the programs and ministries
 - Reserves would be established for future requirements in the Legal,
 Deferred Maintenance and Auto Replacement areas
- Operating Budget included \$113,750 for Departmental Ministries and \$65,000 for Reserves



- Actual Results vs Budget (through 6/30/11):
 - Operating Surplus of \$51,148 vs budget of \$28,630.
 - Revenues under budget by \$25K (assessments)
 - Expenses under budget by \$27K in administrative departments and \$21K in FOS and Departmental ministries
 - Note: Legal fees over budget y \$14K thru 6/30 and this trend is expected to continue
 - With selection of new Chancellor, Executive expenses to increase by \$10K over Q4-2011 as the Chancellor begins work on part-time basis.



Actual vs Budget FY2011 cont'd:


- FOS Revenues through 6/30/11 were only \$7,971 vs budget of \$25K, as no there was no FOS Appeal.
- Departmental ministry expenses (paid by general operating funds) were \$36K vs budget of \$56K.
- TOTAL Surplus as of 6/30/11 was \$389,550, of which \$339,651 represented TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED funds (AAC assessment and Youth Ministry Bequest)



- 6.Develop a budget for the next triennium. Again, this will be discussed in detail by members of the Finance Committee as they present the 2012 budget as adopted by the Metropolitan Council and approved by the Holy Synod.
- 7. Move the investment portfolio and develop an investment strategy and policy. This is in process and we expect to present a plan to the Metropolitan Council at the March 2012 meeting.









The 2012 Proposed OCA Budget


- The Metropolitan Council approved the 2012 Budget at the \$105 assessment level
- The Holy Synod blessed the budget at its meeting in October
- The Holy Synod expressed the reality that additional funding methods MUST be instituted now
- Bishop MICHAEL generously offered to work with the staff to raise \$300,000 in 2012 to be used to fund programs with the stipulation that we work towards a proportional giving methodology over the next 3 years.



Assessment Recommendation

- Re-instituting the FOS Appeal with the goal of funding national programs
- Monitoring the real estate market with the intent to undertake a properly planned relocation project when the value of the Syosset property reaches at least \$5 million
- Holding semi-annual meetings of the OCA and Diocesan Treasurers
- Moving towards Proportional Giving on a diocese by diocese basis by 2014




THE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL IS THE PERMANENT EXECUTIVE BODY OF THE CHURCH ADMINISTRATION WHICH EXISTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THE DECISIONS OF THE ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL AND CONTINUING ITS WORK BETWEEN SESSIONS.

IT CONSISTS OF THE METROPOLITAN AS CHAIRMAN, THE CHANCELLOR, THE SECRETARY, THE TREASURER, TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM EACH DIOCESE, ONE PRIEST AND ONE LAYMAN ELECTED BY THE DIOCESAN ASSEMBLIES, THREE PRIESTS AND THREE LAYMEN ELECTED BY THE ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL. VACANCIES OCCURRING AMONG DIOCESAN REPRESENTATIVES ARE FILLED BY THE RESPECTIVE DIOCESES. TWO ALTERNATES ARE ELECTED BY THE ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL, ONE PRIEST AND ONE LAYMAN, TO FILL VACANCIES OCCURRING AMONG MEMBERS ELECTED BY THE ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL. ALL ELECTED MEMBERS, WHETHER REPRESENTING THE SEVERAL DIOCESES OR THOSE ELECTED BY THE ALL-AMERICAN COUNCIL, SUCCEED THEMSELVES IN OFFICE FOR ONE TERM ONLY.





2010 National Census of US Orthodox Christian Churches

Each local Orthodox parish was asked two questions:

- ➤ How many individual persons in total are associated with the life of your parish: including adults and children, regular and occasional attendees, paid stewards and persons who do not contribute financially?
- ➤ Approximately, how many persons including adults and children attend Liturgy in your parish on a typical Sunday?

Combined, for all US Orthodox Churches:

➤ The answer to the first question is 1,043,800
That is, 1,043,800 persons in the USA participate in Orthodox church life or are at least known to the local parishes: 817,500 Eastern Orthodox Christians + 226,300 Oriental Orthodox Christians

➤ The answer to the second question is **294,300**That is, 294,300 persons are praying in all American Orthodox parishes on a typical Sunday: 214,200 Eastern Orthodox Christians + 80,100 Oriental Orthodox Christians

For the Orthodox Church in America:

- ➤ The answer to the first question is <u>84,200</u>

 That is: total membership of OCA in USA is 84,200

 Including: territorial dioceses 57,500; Romanian

 Episcopate 18,700; Bulgarian Diocese 2,200;


 Albanian Diocese 5,700;
- The answer to the second question is 33,300

 That is: 33,300 persons are praying in all OCA parishes in USA on a typical Sunday
- The ratio between second (33,300) and first (84,200) figures is 40% That is: 40% of all OCA parishioners participate in church life regularly

Membership in US Orthodox Churches


Total number of adherents including children (in 1000)

% of persons who attend regularly in comparison






At the same time, only 29% of the US population live in these five states

Almost half of OCA members live in five states: Alaska - 15%, Pennsylvania - 11%, Ohio - 7%, California - 7%, New York - 6%




How "ethnic" are various Orthodox Churches in USA?






An Active Partnership



- Fr. Steven serves as endorsing representative to COMISS and credentialing bodies.

Serving Institutional Chaplains

- This department reviews and recommends endorsements for Orthodox clergy and laypersons.
 - New endorsements that are institution-specific for chaplains and/or for board certification through credentialing bodies.
 - Five-year peer review updates of endorsement, as well as for those moving to new positions.
- First formal visitation, through this department, of an institutional chaplain occurred in September, 2011.
- Plans to be made for second military and institutional chaplain conference.

Serving the Church

- Institutional Chaplains participate in the life of their respective parishes, and aid in mentoring those interested in ministry. The fruits of their ministry are returned to the celebration of the Divine Liturgy.
- Institutional Chaplain Department is collaborating with the Christian Service and Humanitarian Aid in developing Compassion-in-Action: Parish Ministry Training.
- Institutional Chaplains aid in teaching about care in hospitals, long-term care settings, corrections, and other settings, attend church conferences, and aid in preparing seminarians interested in CPE.

Representation in Greater Pastoral Care and Counseling Community

- Department represented by members at conferences and church gatherings (Ex. SVS Women's Conference).
- Fr. Steven is Chair-Elect of **A**ssociation of **R**eligious **E**ndorsing **B**odies, a body composed of endorsers from a multitude of Faith Traditions. This body actively reinforces the significance of the relationships between faith traditions and credentialing bodies as related to chaplains serving in institutional settings.
